Roanoke Rapids Police Department strongly encourages Halloween Trick-or-Treat Activities take place on Saturday, October 30th from 5:00 PM to 9:00 PM.

Households that do not wish to participate in trick-or-treating should shut off outdoor lights between 5:00 PM and 9:00 PM. Trick-or-treaters are asked to be respectful of homes that are not hosting visitors.

Once again this year, area residents are encouraged to take appropriate health and safety precautions to slow the spread of Covid-19. Additionally, we encourage parents and guardians to share the following Halloween safety tips with their children:

Walk Safely

- Cross streets at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks when possible.
- Look left, right and left again when crossing.
- Put electronic devices down and keep heads up to remain alert.
- Walk, don't run.
- Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible.
- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.

Trick-or-Treat with an Adult

- Children under the age of 12 should not be alone at night without adult supervision. If older kids are mature enough to be out without supervision, remind them to stick to familiar areas that are well-lit.

Keep Costumes Safe

- Wear costumes that are flame-resistant, bright and reflective.
- Choose non-toxic face paint and makeup over full-face masks, which can obstruct a child's vision.
- Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.
- Ensure proper fit to avoid tripping hazards.

Drive with Caution on Halloween

- Slow down and be alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.
- Take extra time to look for kids at intersections, on medians and on curbs.
- Enter and exit driveways and alley ways slowly and carefully.
- Eliminate distractions inside your vehicle, especially the use of smartphones, so you can always concentrate on the road and your surroundings.

Although the City of Roanoke Rapids will officially recognize Halloween on Saturday, October 30th, we understand that some residents may choose to still celebrate on Sunday, October 31st. We encourage our citizens to always be safe and respectful of others. We wish you a spooktacular Halloween!
